About The Speaker

- When we moved to St. Clair Shores in Nov. 1999, I only planted tomatoes & raspberries because we had a large swimming pool (removed 2014).
- Started raising monarch butterflies 12 years ago (2012).
- Since 2013, I have had a native plant garden area & I have stopped using pesticides.
- The native plants in my garden provide food (milkweed) and shelter for monarch caterpillars and butterflies and other plants for other types of butterflies & pollinators.
- June 2021, my husband built 6 raised garden beds for vegetable gardening.
- I use companion plant gardening to reduce insects that eat vegetable plants.

Prepare Your Garden With The Right Soil

- Get your soil tested and add nutrients in the fall for next year.
- You can add crushed eggshells to your soil to boost calcium for tomatoes, pepper plants, roses, hydrangeas, spider plants, ferns, & ivy plants.
- Be careful as adding too much of the eggshells can alter the pH, making it too alkaline.
- Banana peels soaked in water and using the water in your garden will give your soil natural potassium.





Prepare Your Garden With The Right Soil (Cont.)

- Do not use topsoil for your vegetable gardens, it does not add much nutritional value for your veggies & plants. I did use topsoil for years but not anymore.
- I am using organic soil with compost & worm castings.
- For raised beds, I suggest Compost Soil. You can get it delivered in bulk by Soulliere Landscaping Patio and Garden Center or Landscape Supply Yard or other garden centers. It is cheaper to order in bulk, if you have a large area or many raised beds to fill.
- Use natural wood chips not the colored dyed type because of the chemicals used on them, especially in your vegetable garden.







Raised Garden Beds
You don't want to fill the raised bed containers with only the Compost Soil.
I put sticks in the bottom of my own raised bed boxes.

Topsoil varies from load to load, it is a sandy loam soil brown in color. It does not have any nutrional value for your plants. It is used to build up around the house. Also available mixed with our rich black compost. One yard of topsoil is equivalent to 4-5 wheelbarrows full or 15 bushels. We do carry Garden magic topsoil in 40th bags. The bagged topsoil is a mixture of reed sedge peat and sand black in color.

Compost is a black rich composition of decomposed grass and leaves. It is heated up over 150° at this temperature all weed seed and pathogens are killed. It has the water retention capability of peat moss and the nutrient value of a good fertilizer. Excellent addition to the garden or anywhere you are going to plant. Available bulk and bagged.

Compost Manure is odorless and available in 40# bags only. It is made up of reed sedge and composted animal waste. Excellent addition to gardens adding or-

ganic matter.

Calculating Aids

Measuring for Soil

Measure the area needed to cover in square feet. Then determine the average depth you need to fill. Use the table below to find the number of yards needed. Calculations are approximate, so usually it is best to order extra.

*adjust for compaction

Sq. Feet Covered	2" deep	3" deep	4'' deep	6" deep	9" deep	12" deej
200 sq ft	1 1/3 yards	2 yards	2 2/3 yards	4 yards	6 yards	8 yards
300 sq ft	2 yards	3 yards	4 yards	6 yards	9 yards	12 yards
400 sq ft	2 2/3 yards	4 yards	5 1/3 yards	8 yards	12 yards	16 yards
